Business Formal

Business Formal means jackets are required.

Always wear Business Formal to:

- Interviews
- Career Fairs
- Company Presentations*
- Formal Networking Events (e.g. Career Treks)

Business Formal is sometimes referred to as "Business Professional"

APPROPRIATE EXAMPLES:











Business Formal Mistakes



INAPPROPRIATE

- Shirt untucked
- Cotton tee or tank top
- Rolled sleeves on jacket
- Skirt is too short
- Open-toed shoes



INAPPROPRIATE

• Dresses without jackets are unacceptable, including wrap dresses

However: This outfit would be acceptable for business casual dress



INAPPROPRIATE

- Low-cut shirt, possible cleavage
- Informal layering
- Skirt is too short
- Informal jacket
- Unprofessional shoes

Rules of Business Formal

- 1. A matching suit is the best thing to wear.
- 2. If you wear a dress, wear a jacket.
 - Dresses with cardigans are too casual.
- 3. Closed-toed shoes in black, brown or blue.
- 4. Classic button-down shirts or formal blouses only.
- 5. Stay away from:
 - Revealing clothes like tank tops, low-cut blouses, and tight skirts.
 - Casual work clothes like khakis, capri suit pants, wrap dresses, and ¾ length jackets.
 - Fashion fads like untucked shirts covered by vests or "formal tees" under jackets.

When in doubt: Be conservative.

Business Casual

Business Casual means jackets are not required.

Acceptable outfits include:

- Dresses (as long as shoulders are covered)
- Skirts with button-downs or professional blouses
- Pants with button-downs or professional blouses

Business Casual Mistakes



INAPPROPRIATE

- Pants are too tight
- Tight-fitting styles are unacceptable for skirts, pants, shirts and dresses



INAPPROPRIATE

- Skirt is too short
- Skirts should hit at knee, even when worn with tights



INAPPROPRIATE

- Trends like untucked shirts under vests are unprofessional
- Shoes are strappy and unprofessional



INAPPROPRIATE

- Denim is unacceptable
- Shoes are provocative and unprofessional

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General Guidelines

The next few slides provide general guidelines that will help you choose items that will be acceptable for any kind of business dress.

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General Guidelines: Skirts

- Length: skirts should hit at or just above the knee.
- Fit: skirts should never be tight-fitting.

- Black, blue and brown are the safest colors
- No metallics (gold, silver), no provocative styles
- No strappy sandals, flip flops or tennis shoes
